Bio: Dr. Ann Nalley

Dr. Ann Nalley is a Professor of Chemistry in the Physical Science Department at Cameron University, a position that she has held since 1969. She has held positions as a visiting scientist or professor in the Chemistry Departments at the University of Oklahoma and the University of Texas at Dallas, and the Polymer Science Department at the University of Southern Mississippi. She earned a Bachelor of Science Degree at Northeastern Oklahoma State University, a Master's Degree in Analytical Chemistry at Oklahoma State University, and a Ph.D. in Radiation Chemistry from Texas Woman's University. Her research includes new product development and solving industrial problems in the area of cosmetic analysis, nanostructural materials, applied research in the petroleum industry and computer molecular modeling. She served as the President of the American Chemical Society in 2006. In her spare time, she finds time to maintain a pet refuge for over 40 displaced or deserted animals.

DIRECTIONS AND PARKING

Directions to San Antonio Garage (SAG) from South I-35: Take the MLK. Exit #-235A, and turn left (west) on MLK. Continue on M.L.K. for about 6/10 of a mile. Turn right on San Antonio St.(which is the next street after Guadalupe), then right on 24th Street. Turn immediately left back onto San Antonio St. The Parking Garage entrance will be to your left at the end of the block.

TAKE YOUR GARAGE ENTRY TICKET WITH YOU.

You will need to have it processed at the garage cashier's booth prior to leaving. Parking is is \$9 for the whole day, less for shorter times. There may be free parking available near campus, but watch the signs carefully!

Directions to San Antonio Garage (SAG) from North I-35: From the I-35 LOWER DECK. (need to be in left lanes to enter lower deck), take the 32nd Street & Dean Keaton exit # 236A. Go thru light at 32nd street and make sure to get in the right hand lane. Make right turn at Dean Keaton. Take Dean Keaton Street until in dead ends into Guadalupe. Turn left onto Guadalupe and immediately get into the right hand lane. Turn right onto 24th Street and then make an immediate right onto San Antonio. The parking garage will be on your left hand side.

Walking directions from San Antonio Garage (SAG) to Welch Hall (WEL):

Walk South on San Antonio Street (away from 25th St.) Turn Left on 24th Street. Turn right in between Painter Hall (PAI) and Welch Hall (WEL). Turn left again, to enter Welch on the Inner Campus Drive side. The keynote talk and breakfast will be in Welch 3.502, which is accessible from the outside of the building.
